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Actions on issues discussed at Phoenix Public Meeting – Duffy

Lack of community representatives from Weston Creek in the rebuilding process.

On the Community and Expert Reference Group (CERG) Weston Creek have two members – The Chair of the Weston Creek Community Council [Jeff Carl] and a member of the Phoenix Association executive committee [Karla Ries]. Duffy residents who lost their house were represented on CERG until about October 2003 by Liz Tilley. Other community representatives from fire-affected areas are Rural Lessees [Dr Tony Griffin], Mount Taylor Estate Resident's Association and ACT Housing tenants [Jo Matthews] and Rural Villages [Wendy Anderson]. There have always been 5 representatives from fire-affected communities within the 17 member CERG (ie nearly one-third of the membership).

No LAPAC (Local Area Planning & Advisory Committee) and no CPF (Community Planning Forum) in Weston Creek

There has never been a LAPAC in Weston Creek because it was previously not considered a target for redevelopment. However the WCCC has raised concerns with Minister Corbell MLA on the issue of no CPF scheduled for Weston Creek. See minutes August 2003 regular monthly meeting pg 2

The recent passage of DV 200 – the Garden City Variation through the ACT Assembly is allowing dual occupancies in the fire –affected blocks.

Mr. Jeff Carl, Chairperson, and Ms Pat McGinn Deputy Chairperson presented the Weston Creek Community Council (WCCC) submission to the ACT Legislative Assembly Standing Committee on Planning and the Environment.

If DV 200 was not in place fire-affected blocks would be subject to the ‘old’ planning rules and the situations would be worse – eg the Kathner St dual occupancies could have been triple occupancies.
